

Ring Resizing Guide (No Printer Required)

So it looks like some of the most common methods offered by most online sources have some issues with helping you figure out your ring size. That is why we have provided this simple step-by-step on how to check your ring size or whoever else's ring size right from the comfort of your home. Getting started is easy and won't require any pesky printers.

What You Are Going To Need:

- 1 Piece of paper (preferably larger than A5)
- 1 Pen
- 1 Ruler
- A Pair of Scissors
- The sizing chart at the bottom of this pdf

The Method:

STEP 1 Cut out a rectangle of 1/4 inch wide and 6 inches in length.

STEP 2 Wrap this strip of paper around your finger and mark where it overlaps.

STEP 3 Now measure the strip of paper from the beginning to the mark.

STEP 4 With your measurements, refer to our sizing chart for your accurate ring size.

The Sizing Chart:

Size	(mm)	(inches)
3	44.2	1.74
4	46.8	1.84
5	49.3	1.94
6	51.9	2.04
7	54.4	2.14
8	57	2.24
9	59.5	2.34
10	62.1	2.44
11	64.6	2.54
12	67.2	2.65
13	69.7	2.75

Helpful Hints:

◇ Fingers change size during the day- measure your fingers at the end of the day when they are their largest.

◇ Finger size also changes with weather and temperature- measure your finger when it is moderately warm.

◇ If your finger doesn't fall directly into one size, choose the larger size.

◇ Fingers tend to be one half-size larger on your dominant hand
